Dear People of God,

Sickness abounds in our house. For almost 2 weeks a few different sicknesses have made their rounds. "Cover your mouth, please!" and "Wash your hands!" and "Don't drink from his cup!" have all been said many times over. There isn't a household that doesn't experience this. I've even heard some schools didn't hold session due to the number of students absent for sickness. It's believed winter and the cold air should be helpful to "freeze sicknesses" or "clean the air." Actually, low temperatures can increase the likeliness of getting sick. No one likes being sick. "Ramp-up your regimen of vitamins" we say, "Eat good foods!", "Get some sleep and stay warm!", "Practice good hygiene!"

And still we get sick. It's a serious problem we will never be rid of in this life.

God, and His people, take the sickness of sin even more seriously. He sets the Cross before our eyes, telling us both, what sin has done, and what He has done to remove our guilt and do away with the sickness of our sin. In Holy Baptism He applies the cross to us. Washed away is our sin! The Holy Spirit regenerates us! regenerates us with His Spirit! We are justified by His grace! Sin-sick people have the hope of eternal life!

With this faith and hope, Christians are bold to confess our sin sickness to be cleansed daily in the remembrance of our Baptism, and often in Confession and Absolution.

With the Psalmist, we pray: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love;

according to your abundant mercy

blot out my transgressions.

Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

and cleanse me from my sin!

Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;

wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. (Psalm 51:1-2, 7)

With St. Paul we rejoice:

[Christ sanctifies the Church], having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. (Ephesians 5:26-27)

The sickness of sin does stick with us until our death, or until Christ returns first. Though we yet feel and experience it, sin is gone in Christ. We are washed, cleansed, and redeemed by the blood of Jesus. The Church is the hospital for sinners--the place where our sin and guilt is treated; the place where the dead in sin are given life in Christ; the place we are refreshed every Sunday as we open our hands and our mouths (and sing and pray!) to receive and share the Cup of Blessing and drink the cleansing and life-giving blood of Jesus.

Midweek Services & Suppers begin on March 5th - Ash Wednesday. Suppers served at 5:30 with services at 7:00.



Happy New Year! The Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry is open: Mondays 9:00 am to 7:00 pm; Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00 am to 4:00 pm; and Fridays 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. The clothing room is closed on Fridays. The Food Pantry will be **closed on President's Day, Monday, February 17**. Food is distributed, and donations are gratefully accepted during business hours. We also have collection boxes in the vestibule at Fareway, NOSH, and at Inspire Continuing

Care for donations. If the Geneseo Schools are closed due to weather, the Food Pantry is also closed.

Because of the community's generous support, the Food Pantry provided food and emergency assistance to **340** households in December. In addition to our regular food distribution, we provided each of these families with Christmas baskets. Thanks to the many donors who make all this possible!

We are a **full choice** food pantry, which means guests choose the food they take home. Households that meet requirements may receive food once per month. Anyone may shop in the clothing room once per week.


